

Purpose

- To work under the supervision framework of Bowness-on-Solway Primary School.
- To organise & undertake a range of varied tasks to support children's personal care and development by providing activities for parents to support their child's learning either in or outside the room.

Key Responsibilities

- Interact with parents and children within the planned environment adjusting activities according to parent's and children's responses.
- Contribute to learning by providing activities to support children's learning.
- Contribute to children's social, emotional and physical wellbeing in line with the statutory framework for the EYFS (2023).
- Support parents' understanding of their role within their child's learning.
- Encourage experiential learning and promote inclusion of all children and parents/carers in and outside of the room.
- Prepare and clear away resources, ensuring they are available for use.
- Verbally share routine information about children with parents/carers, other staff, internal and external agencies, as appropriate.
- Be aware of and comply with all settings policies and procedures including code of conduct, child protection, health and safety, security, confidentiality and data protection, reporting all concerns to a nominated person.
- Within the context of the setting's behaviour policy, use initiative to deal with issues that
 arise and encourage children to develop and take responsibility for their own behaviour.
